The Voluntary Service, Department of Veterans Affairs, CNVAMC 2018 Volunteer Awards Recognition Ceremony was held on Wednesday, April 11, 2018 at the Enterprise Mill Event Center in Augusta, Georgia. Three Assembly 1074 Knights received service awards. Vince Ingrasciotta received an award pin for 500 volunteer hours, Dick Schreck for 1000 hours, and I got a certificate for 12 years and 1524 hours. 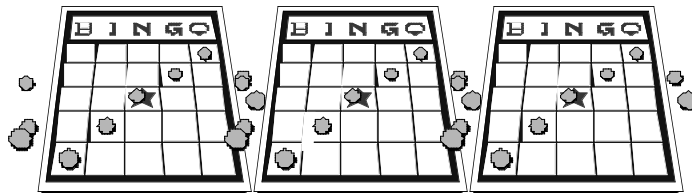
