Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible

Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible, presented by Jeff Cavins, makes the complex simple. It helps us uncover the story woven through Scripture so that we can get the "big picture" of the Bible and understand what it is all about. The Bible is a story about the Father's unfailing love for us, a love that we are called to share with others.

Protestant Revolution

In The Protestant Revolution, Trent Horn introduces us to Martin Luther and the events that shaped his thinking and led him to "protest" against his Catholic Faith. The film investigates common myths about the Reformation and the key ideas Luther espoused that resulted in the breaking away of believers and the establishment of non-Catholic Christian religions, We will learn about the concepts of "Sola scripture" and Sola fide and why they are wrong, and about the Protestants changes to the Canon of Scripture.
